## CSC pips SCC I to league crown

CEYLON Sports Club is the Singapore Cricket Association's Division One League champion this year.

Needing a win to clinch the maximum 16 points to displace Singapore Cricket Club I for the crown, CSC defeated SCC II by 86 runs at Balestier Road on Sunday to finish top of the seven-team, two-round league.

"This is the most satisfying result for me and the club in the last few years," said CSC skipper Sarika Prasad, whose dedication and astute captaincy were crucial factors in transforming the team into a fighting unit.

"We did not have any big names or stars," added the 41-year-old all-rounder. "We just had one change from the previous year in Budhika Mendis. It was basically the same team which worked hard and everyone contributed to the success."

CSC scored 261-9 in its 50 overs before dismissing SCC II for 175 in 43 overs for its ninth win. Mendis contributed significantly again with 82 runs and 3-21 in his 10 overs.
