## Law 24.2 Fair Delivery: The ARM

For a delivery to be fair the ball must be bowled, not thrown - (see Note below). If either umpire is not entirely satisfied with the absolute fairness of the delivery in this respect, he shall call and signal 'no-ball' instantly upon delivery.

### Note

Definition of a throw. A ball shall be deemed to have been thrown if, in the opinion of either Umpire, the process of straightening the bowling arm, whether it be partial or complete, takes place during that part of the delivery swing which directly precedes the ball leaving the hand. This definition shall not debar a bowler from the use of wrist in the delivery swing.

### Reports from the boundary line:

- \* **Kiran More** holds the record for most stumpings in a Test. He stumped six West Indian batsmen in Chennai during the 1987 - 88 series.
- \* **Tiger Pataudi** was the youngest player to lead in Test Cricket at 21 years and 72 days old (India v West Indies at Bridgetown in 1961 - 62).

### Stamp of Sobers

The first cricketer to be specifically depicted on a postage stamp was Sir Garfield Sobers, on a 35 cent stamp issued by Barbados on December 2, 1966.
